Program Background

The Education Center for the Entertainment Arts, a program of the Hollywood Entertainment Museum, utilizes the power of media to engage, teach and inspire youth. Our after school programs provide entertainment industry-related education to youth and introduce a variety of disciplines available on the front line and behind the scenes, which are transferable to any career. Youth are also taught the essence of leadership, teamwork, creativity, and responsibility.

General Position Overview

Our instructors provide entertainment arts education courses in 10-week sessions in their particular field of study to teens in community day schools, high schools, probation camps and other locations throughout Los Angeles County. As an industry professional, instructors also serve as role models and give youth the motivation and empowerment to pursue post secondary education and/or a promising career. Courses include Acting, Animation, Art, Graphic Design, Music Production, Photography, Screenwriting, Video Production, and Video Editing.

- Classes are typically held after school for two hours

Minimum Qualifications

- Experience working with and teaching youth and teens who are at-risk
- Minimum of 2 years experience working in entertainment, arts, teaching or related field
- Have a passion for enriching the lives of youth
- Strong communication skills, computer literate and proficient with current industry software for specific course
- Bachelor's degree in related course preferred
- Pass a Fingerprint and TB Test
